

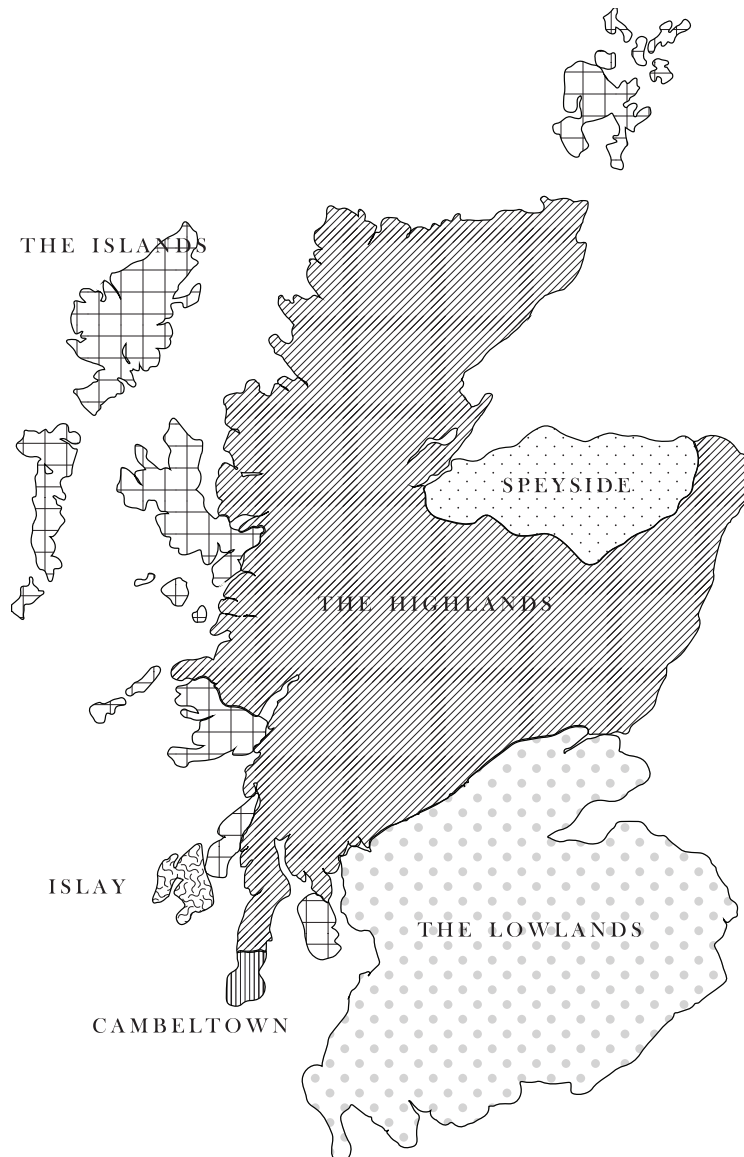

SCOTCH

SCOTCH WHISKY

By law, Scotch is a distilled spirit made in Scotland from malted barley and aged in oak casks for a minimum of three years. Single malt scotch whiskies can only be the product of one distillery, while blended scotches may consist of as many as 50 different single whiskies from different distilleries.

Today, with more than 100 distilleries in Scotland, it's easy to get lost in the selection. Each region in Scotland is known for distinct characteristics in its whiskies, which are the result of geographical differences such as water sources and proximity to the sea.



SPEYSIDE

Speyside has more distilleries than any other region in the country. The Speyside style has changed over time, but recent expressions are sweet and subtle, honeyed and fine, and loved for their smooth bodies and fruity notes. A heavily sherried Speyside single malt can be the perfect companion to a medium-bodied cigar. Well-known distilleries from this region include Glenlivet, Glenfiddich, and Macallan.

THE HIGHLANDS

The Highlands represent the largest geographic region; these whiskies generally have heavier bodies than their Lowland counterparts.

To the north there are big-bodied single malts with cereal sweetness and richness (think: Dalmore); toward the south there are lighter, fruitier whiskies with a definite dryness (Aberfeldy is a shining example); to the east there are some full-bodied, dry whiskies with lots of fruit and pungency (Glen Garioch is one such distillery); the western Highlands offer full body and real power with peaty, smoky overtones (Ben Nevis).

THE ISLANDS

The Islands are not actually recognised as an independent region by the Scotch Whisky Association because they are technically part of the Highlands. Due to their proximity to the sea, Island malts retain some of the iodine and salt of Islay whiskies, though not as intensely.

THE LOWLANDS

With only a handful of distilleries in operation, Lowland whiskies are a dying breed. These malts are traditionally distilled three times, giving them a very light body and taste. The “Lowland Ladies,” as they are affectionately called, are known for their more gentle, floral whiskies.

ISLAY

Islay whiskies are known for their smoky character, as well as notes of iodine and sea salt. Such characteristics are attributed to the peat smoke used to dry the malt and the exposure of the casks to strong sea airs.

CAMPBELTOWN

Campbeltown was once one of the most prolific regions in Scotland. Sadly, Prohibition in the US affected the area and now there are only three distilleries, only two of which are currently producing whisky. Single malt whiskies from this region are known for their dryness and often for their pungency.

IRISH WHISKEY

The word “whiskey” comes from “uisce beatha”, Gaelic for “water of life.” Irish whiskey generally has a smoother finish compared to the smoky, earthy overtones common to some Scotches because peat is rarely used in the malting process. However, there are notable exceptions, like Connemara Peated Single Malt Irish Whiskey. Irish whiskey must be distilled in Ireland and aged for a minimum of three years in wooden casks.

CANADIAN WHISKY

Most Canadian whiskies are blended multi-grain liquors containing a large percentage of corn spirits, and are typically lighter and smoother than other whisky styles. When Canadian distillers began adding small amounts of highly-flavorful rye grain to their mashes, people began demanding this new rye-flavored whisky, referring to it simply as “rye.” Today, “rye whisky” and “Canadian whisky” are used interchangeably. To qualify, it must be mashed, distilled, and aged at least three years in Canada in wooden barrels, which may be new or used, charred or uncharred.

A M E R I C A N W H I S K E Y

The most notable American whiskey is probably bourbon, however, there's also rye whiskey, rye malt whiskey, malt whiskey, wheat whiskey, and corn whiskey to choose from. All are made from mashes with at least 51% of their named grains. Bourbon is made from at least 51% corn and must be aged in new charred oak barrels. Unlike scotch, there is no minimum specified aging requirement. The exception is straight bourbon, which must be aged for at least two years with no added colouring, flavouring, or other spirits.
